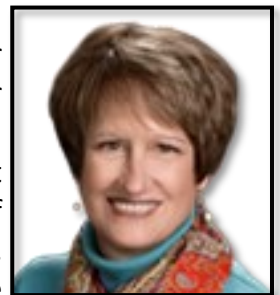

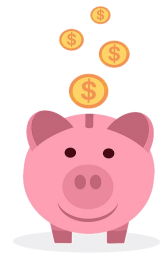

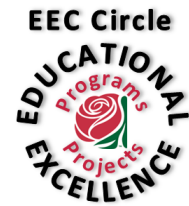

## Theta Presents Educator Grants

**Theta Chapter** (Region IV, Brunswick, New Hanover, Pender) is pleased to announce the 2021 winners of our educator grants. The \$500 grants were established in 2019 and are available to teachers in New Hanover and Pender counties. In 2021, the four grants were awarded to teachers in New Hanover County Schools.

Lizette Day, a specialist at Carolina Beach Elementary School, will work with kindergarten teachers and students at three schools, where she will introduce Coding Concepts to the teachers and students. Haley Miles, a first-grade teacher at Bradley Creek Elementary School, will purchase High Noon Books that are phonics-based literature with high-interest topics. She will engage her students with these books using decoding skills to build reading confidence. The fourth-grade team at Carolina Beach Elementary School, including Melinda Durant, science and social studies teacher; Tracy Tugwell, math teacher; and Carrie Boos, reading teacher, will incorporate computational thinking and coding into the core content areas using Sphero the Mini Robot. Mary Porter, a third-grade teacher at Pine Valley Elementary School, will purchase four sets of informational books that have various reading levels. These books will allow Porter to meet the needs of her students in her guided reading groups.

In spring 2022, the educator grant winners will attend Theta's Founders' Day meeting and report on their progress with the projects.

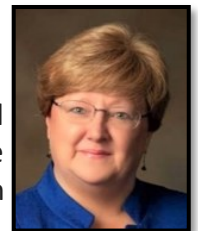
