### NC DKG Education Foundation Grants - Learning/Literacy Project

Last Winter, I applied for the NC DKG Education Foundation Grant for Learning/Literacy Project. In conjunction with Rebekah Stanton, media coordinator at Rock Springs Elementary, we created a project for exposing elementary students to careers through literature.

Lincoln County Schools is dedicated to the career development of all students and spent the last year focusing on providing opportunities for more exposure to careers in the elementary schools across the district. Thanks to the NC DKG Education Foundation, we received \$500 to provide Rock Springs Elementary with 27 library-bound career texts at a variety of reading levels for students. Because career fields change rapidly, we aimed for all books we ordered to have been published within the last five years.

The focus of this project was to increase circulation of career exploration books within the student body. To do this, we focused on creating an interactive book display in the library. Additionally, since November was Career Development month, Ms. Stanton conducted book talks in each of her media classes through the month to introduce students to the new material. We are excited to look at the circulation data, compare it to previous years, and hopefully replicate the project!

### Spring Convention Project Announced

The 2023 NC DKG Convention Project is collecting food and monetary funds for the Food Bank of the Albemarle located in Elizabeth City. The Food Bank of the Albemarle helps fight hunger and poverty in northeast NC, serving Beaufort, Bertie, Camden, Chowan, Currituck, Dare, Gates, Hertford, Hyde, Martin, Northampton, Pasquotank, Perquimans, Tyrrell, and Washington counties. The Food Bank is collecting canned items such as meats, proteins, vegetables, fruits and soups; dry goods such as pasta, cereal, rice and dried beans. In addition to food items, toiletries, personal hygiene items, toilet tissue, and laundry soap are very much needed to help families.
