# "Knickers for New Life" Supported By Region X Event

The Alpha Nu Chapter hosted a program for all chapters in Region X on Saturday, February 26th. It was held in the fellowship hall of the First Baptist Church in Morganton at the historic Kistler House annex. The program, Knickers for New



Life (KFNL) presented by Watha Kollmeyer, was a HUGE success.

Rhonda Hager represented Delta Sigma at this event. She shared, "Region X came out in full force wearing their DKG nametags, ready to meet new sisters and learn more about Knickers for New Life from Watha." The event was also attended by the state leadership team.

Watha has an inspiring story and was the keynote speaker at NC DKG virtual convention in 2021. She told her story through pictures as she described the living and school conditions in western Uganda. In Uganda, running water and toilets are not easily found, leading to many diseases and causing numerous health issues. In addition, the poverty in Uganda causes many to go without the basics of underwear ("knickers" in the British terminology) and sanitary products. Attendees learned how KFNL supplies allow girls to attend school even when they begin their menstrual cycle. Otherwise, they could not attend due to lack of basic hygiene products. Generally, every year of education for a young girl delays becoming a mom by at least another year. Once becoming a mom, education is left behind as a priority. Knickers for a New Life is making a huge difference in Uganda, currently supporting over 3500 students in six schools. This support is life changing for students.

The Region X event also raised money for KFNL to assist in providing a new life for many young girls. Prior to starting the program, Watha had displays of *ASANTE Scents for a Cause* items for sale, with proceeds benefitting KFNL. Attendees also had the opportunity to purchase raffle tickets to

win a beautiful gift basket and several gift boxes of Certified Direct Trade Uganda Dark Chocolate. All proceeds from the raffle also went to support Knickers for New Life. The total amount raised from the raffle, centerpieces, miscellaneous donations, and money given directly to Watha was \$2647.00. In addition, Alpha Nu provided a booth for chapters to give their coins or any other amount to UNICEF for Schools for Africa.

Alpha Nu Chapter did an amazing job hosting this outstanding event providing wonderful snacks and

personalizing name tags for seating assignments to ensure opportunities for attendees to meet a fellow sister from another chapter. Rhonda shared, "It was so much fun socializing with long time sisters and meeting new sisters in Morganton."

### Knickers for New Life (KFNL) Fast Facts

Most girls in Uganda miss a week of school each month and eventually drop out.

Without an education, these girls are faced with a life of poverty, disease and HIV, child marriage/teen pregnancy, and are at risk for human trafficking.

KFNL focuses on providing access to basic sanitary products - undergarments (knickers) and sanitary pads.

A donation of \$35 helps one girl (with knickers/pads for one year to stay in school.

KFNL also helps to build girl's and boy's latrines, provides mosquito-repellant soaps, and Tippy Tap hand wash stations.

Currently, KFNL serves six schools and over 3500 students.


### **DKG News Available Online**



## **Sister-Sister Spotlight**

"I thank you for giving me *Renee Smith* as my Sister-Sister partner. Meeting at Lincolnton High where Renee has taught math for 20 years and now head of the department, and where I had also taught math, we talked about family, religion, education, and life in general – a rewarding experience."



I asked Renee, "Why do you LOVE education?" Renee's response was, "I love those light bulb moments especially from the lower students. They seemed to have more AH HA moments. It is exciting to see them grow. Not

only do I want to help all become better students, but also better people. I do not hesitate to tell them I love them and to let me know if they are having a bad day. ... High school students stay hungry and they cannot learn if they are hungry. I keep snacks such as granola bars for any student who is hungry."

We continued with the question, "What drove you to make a difference choosing the profession?" Renee responded, "I did not just choose this profession and pursue it immediately after high school. My path to this point had a lot of stops, curves, and detours. Being part of a military family, I graduated from high school in Germany. Influenced by my math teacher and his wife, I attended college, studying math for a year and a half in Hawaii where I had relatives. Then I met my future husband who was in the army, stationed in Hawaii and from Lincolnton, NC. We returned to Lincolnton, married, and have two special needs children.

Other professions I tried were not satisfying. I realized God was calling me back to the teaching profession. I earned my degree from Lenoir Rhyne University, did student teaching under Libby Fletcher, and was then hired by Rhonda Hager, the principal at LHS at that time. It is the God in me that wants me to meet these students on their level, nurture them to become a whole person/student and also teach them some math – this is my goal!"
