Carlson, Chairman of the Foundation Board, made the announcement. Standing with her were members of the Foundation Board of Directors. Dr. Carlson thanked members for their generous support for



the 100 Challenge and announced over \$16,000 has been pledged from Eta State members and non-members. Over time, core values will be established to undergird all areas of the Foundation's work. Core values are those guiding principles that—along with the Foundation's mission and purpose, bylaws, policies and procedures and state/federal rules and regulations will undergird and guide the operation of the Foundation. Dr. June Atkinson Wins 2015 Founders Award

By a vote of the 1981 convention, a Founders Award was set aside to honor a NC woman who may or may not be a member of The Delta Kappa Gamma Society International and who has made an outstanding contribution to the improvement of the quality of human life through education, research, publications, or service. The award, the highest honor Eta State can bestow upon a woman is Presented at the convention the second year of the biennium.

This year the award was given to Dr. June Atkinson, the current State Superintendent of N.C. Public Schools and the first woman elected to that

position. With more than 35 years of experience in education, Dr. Atkinson oversees almost 1.5 million students I over 2,500 public schools. She has received numerous Awards over the years including recent accolades such as the Champion of Children Award from the NC Association of School Administrators, The State Policy Maker of the Year Award from the National Association for State Educational Technology Directors among others. She currently serves on the Board of Directors for the National Council of Chief State School Officers.
