Hosted by the Scholarship/ World Fellowship/Schools for Africa/Educational Law and Policy committees, the meeting began with a greeting from Jennifer Carroll. Elaine Jenkins led the invocation. DKG members celebrated the eighth birthday of Delta Sigma, which was chartered April 18, 2010. Anna Mullen catered dinner and Guy Rudisill provided musical entertainment. Chairperson Libby Fletcher introduced the special guests from Region X Eta State.

Chairperson of the Eta State Awards Committee, Donna Rudisill lives in Claremont and has been a member of Nu Chapter in Catawba County since 2000. She is instructional technology facilitator for Catawba County schools and has been in education for 29 years.
