Delta Sigma Community Service Project

As teachers, we have all seen that child with the vacant gaze who you know has a life none of us would want for a child. Sometimes these children have witnessed drug abuse and domestic violence. They have moved from house to house and school to school. They carry worries that only adults should struggle with. Will we have heat? Will the water be cut off? Will we have food? Will my family members hurt each other or me? These children often end up in DSS custody living in foster homes.

At the summer planning meeting, the Delta Sigma membership voted to assist these foster children by donating funds to Speak Up for Children, Inc. This will be the chapter's community service project for the coming year. Speak Up for Children, Inc. is a non-profit organization created by Lincoln County Guardians ad Litem. The Guardian ad Litem (GAL) program is a state-wide initiative in which volunteers are appointed by the court system to be advocates for foster children. GAL's are not allowed to give any gifts or assistance to the children they represent. In order to meet the unfunded needs of the children, the GAL's formed Speak Up For Children, Inc. The organization raises funds and gives grants and scholarships to those foster children in need.

Delta Sigma members voted to make donations to Speak Up for Children throughout the year. The donations will go to provide the foster children with experiences or items they would not otherwise have an opportunity to enjoy. So far this year, Speak Up For Children has provided opportunities for children to receive tutoring, be fitted with braces, go to the prom, attend camp, get a camp t-shirt, receive visits from their grandparents, have birthday parties, get a car seat, have games and puzzles in DSS visitation rooms, and be given their own hardback books. Through this community service project, the chapter will have an opportunity to help make the abnormal lives of these foster children as normal as possible.

Orientation of New Initiates

The membership committee had a busy, productive day together on August 16th. After enjoying the wonderful luncheon and fellowship with our first year teachers, the membership committee along with help from Jane Morton and Wanda Lutz met to plan our September 26th dinner and initiation. We look forward to a great attendance from our membership to welcome our new initiates into the Delta Sigma chapter.

Later in the afternoon, an orientation of new initiates was held at Lincolnton Middle School. Our chapter leadership, Elaine Jenkins and Deanna Dunn, along with initiate sponsors Wanda Lutz and Becky Heavner, assisted me in introducing Delta Kappa Gamma to our initiates. I encourage all members to revisit our purpose and our history before the initiation ceremony. The importance of our selection into this wonderful society of women educators should inspire our service and the goals we set as a new school year begins.
